

- Psalm 3 – Psalm 7 David is putting together a series of conditions/circumstances he finds himself in and he takes those needs and places them at Gods feet.
- David's life created enemies. People did not like him.
- "Preach the gospel to everyone and sometimes use words."
- When you are living the life of Christ, don't expect people to congratulate you. Expect enemies and people mocking you.
- John 15:18
- The world will hate you.
- Use the ethic of the Christian life in your own life to live.
- Your life will make waves.
- We are not being salt and light when we live like the world.
- David declares that all that is good in him comes from God, not him.
- Jesus was 100% God but he was also 100% human. While he was a man, he filled himself with the Holy Spirit and lived the life as a human living in God's will.
- As we surrender ourselves to God he is engaged on his behalf to carry out his plan through us.
 - When God does all the work we call it grace.
 - David was a receiver of the grace of God.

- Paul gave credit to God. He understood it was God working through him and that Paul himself had been crucified to make room for God.
- If man could be good enough to gain heaven then Christ died in vain.
- The Lord delights in those who fear Him, who put their hope in His unfailing love.
- We think the path to gaining God's approval is in our actions.
- God is not impressed with man's doing, period.
- God is impressed with man receiving.
- God's people are grace people.
- How do you repay God for all he has done?
- David repaid by going and asking for more.
- Every member of earth has received by God's grace.
- God's grace is infinite. You cannot deplete the resources of his grace.
 - You take from God's grace and more becomes available.
- God took every sin and he judged it through his son. He did something we could never do for ourselves. He did it because he is graceful.
 - The character of God's love desires that you would accept and take his grace.
 - When you accept it more becomes available.
